Two suspects arrested by the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department

VALLEY GLEN, CA – A shooting incident occurred at Los Angeles Valley College on Saturday, January 25, 2014. The incident was not campus related and there were no classes or campus activities taking place when it occurred. The Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department is currently handling the investigation, and two suspects have been taken into custody. The campus is open, and winter session classes and college services resumed on Monday, January 27, 2014.

According to a press release by the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department, "the choice of the college parking lot was random."
