L.A. VALLEY COLLEGE TO OFFER 150+ CLASSES FOR WINTER SESSION 2016

High-demand UC/CSU-transferrable courses to help students graduate or transfer

VALLEY GLEN, CA – Los Angeles Valley College (LAVC) announced that it will offer a 5-week winter session from January 4-February 7, 2016.

“To help our students reach their educational goals, Valley College will be offering more than 150 high-demand courses—mainly UC/CSU-transferrable classes—this winter,” said Dr. Erika Endrijonas, president of Los Angeles Valley College. “This diverse selection of classes will enable more students to “step forward” towards graduating or transferring to a four-year college or university.”

Winter session will feature course sections in more than 40 disciplines including English, Math, Chemistry, Biology, Political Science, History, and Communication Studies. Priority registration for designated groups begins on October 26.
