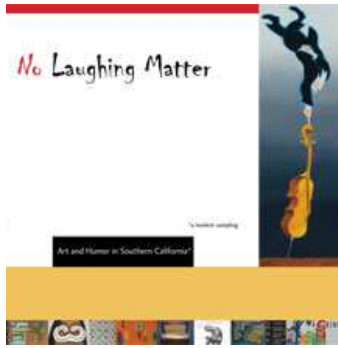
You're Invited to Meet the New Foundational Skills Counselors

Partnership with Valley Presbyterian Hospital Leads to the First Graduating Class of the Nurse Scholars Program

Valley Presbyterian Hospital recently celebrated the graduation of 16 LAVC students in its Nurse Scholars Program. The program, which was funded by Valley Presbyterian Hospital through a \$1.4 million grant from the Unihealth Foundation, featured a unique partnership of Valley Presbyterian Hospital, LAVC and COPE Health Solution to nurture the next-generation of nurses. Valley Presbyterian Hospital provided full scholarships to the students selected to the program at LAVC, and upon graduation secured full-time staff positions for all 16 graduates. A second class of 12 nursing students is scheduled to graduate in December 2010.
