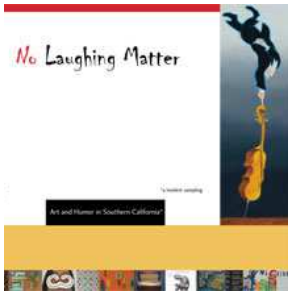
Spring 2010 Careers Speaker Series Begins with a “Careers in Education” Session
