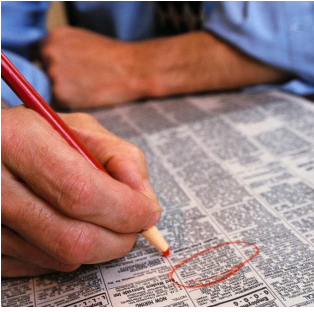
Hillel 818 Invites You to a Coffee & Conversation with Ed Asner

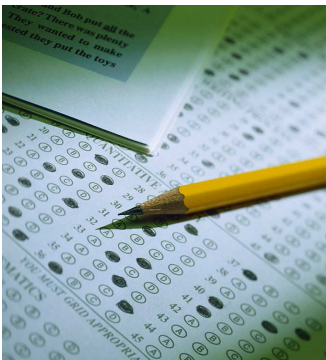

LAVC Upward Bound Students Prepare for College/University by Taking the SATs

Students in LAVC's Upward Bound program scored well on the SATs they took on March 13. Of the 32 students in the program, 16 of them who took the exam scored over 1400 with several scoring over 1700. While the scores are not what some would consider high, many of these at-risk students have struggled academically and these scores are great success for them. The Upward Bound program prepares at-risk 9th to 12th graders who would be the first in their family to attend an institution of higher education. The students prepared for the SAT test by attending study sessions on Friday evenings and Saturdays. Many Upward Bound students are also planning on retaking the test on June 5.

Using this debit card, students will now have the fastest and easiest way to gain access to their money—literally the same day the District releases it. In addition, the company will be placing two ATM machines on campus.
