QUALIFICATIONS:

Minimum:

- Master's degree in music OR Bachelor's in music AND Masters in humanities OR the equivalent

Preferred:

- At least two years of music teaching experience, ideally in a college setting
- Ability to teach undergraduate piano, harmony and musicianship classes that range from beginning to intermediate levels
- Performance proficiency in piano
- Demonstrated fluency in music theory (harmony and musicianship)
- Experience in piano performance and composition, harmony and musicianship development and integration, and recruitment
- Sensitivity to and understanding of the diverse academic, cultural, socioeconomic, and ethnic backgrounds of community college students
- Enthusiasm for and knowledge of effective teaching and learning strategies and the assessment of student learning (e.g., Student Learning Outcomes)

- Interest or experience in technology, especially in developing Online or Distance Education courses, knowledge of computer/music software, commercial music techniques, and directing/coaching chamber ensembles

ASSIGNMENT:

Duties include:

- Teach sequential courses in piano, harmony and musicianship, including tonal theory through 20th-century trends, solfege, ear training; participate in student advisement; assist in curriculum and program development; contribute to the life of the college, including committee participation and professional development.
- Typical assignment is 15 hours per week plus regular office hours. Evening and day schedules may be included in the assignment. Opportunities may exist for summer and winter intersession teaching.

The Los Angeles Community College District determines placement on the pay scale depending on verified education and employment history. Current starting annual salary range is \$47,600-\$74,110. Benefits include medical, dental, vision for employees and eligible dependents, term life insurance, and (State Teachers Retirement System) retirement program.
