Broadcasting is a field within the entertainment industry that involves sharing speech, music, visual images, information, etc. by radio, television or other mass communication mediums. Broadcasting technicians install and operate equipment, such as audio mixing consoles, media control systems, oscilloscopes, frequency analyzers, and satellite receivers, used to broadcast radio and television programs.


