Area Description: CalWORKs is an education and training program established for students receiving Temporary Assistance to Needy Families (TANF) to aid them in becoming economically self-sufficient. Our goal is to provide an educational environment where students may develop the needed vocational skills leading to meaningful employment, earn vocational certificates or Associate degrees, or take courses leading to transfer to 4 year universities. The program offers assistance with program planning, tuition, childcare, books, tutoring, paid Work Study, job placement, and community referrals.
