UNITY CLUB CONSTITUTION

ARTICLE 1: ORGANIZATION

A. Name: Unity Club

B. Purpose

Unity is a manageable skill applicable to different areas. Unity is an essential element for success in any aspect of life. People need to develop unity skills for individual, organizational and social activities and for success. On the individual level, unity is when thoughts and actions perform best together. Every student needs to use the different parts of their physical, mental, and psychological abilities in harmony to reach the highest peak or performance and prevent the wasting of time and energy. These goals will be achievable with the three main tools of the Unity Club, such as training, coaching, and practicing the aspects of unity.

By reaching unity, the members of LAVC Unity Club will:

- Unite with their own self and with others
- Be more goal-oriented: know what they want and how to achieve it
- Use time wisely: learn how to set real, achievable, short-term and long-term objectives.
- Achieve successful results in academic and career pursuits
- Be more social: create a new network with students and faculty
- Develop an ability to help and lead others
- Gain academic recognition
- Get an advantage on university transfer

Based on the needs of individual members, training courses will be online, in lecture, coaching and consulting by phone face to face, and by appointment.

ARTICLE 2: MEMBERSHIP

A. Eligibility

All club membership must be open to all regularly enrolled students who are members of the Associated Student Union at LAVC.

B. Special requirements for Membership

Membership may not be limited on the basis of age, race, religion or national origin.

There will be no inactive members or alumni members.

Membership will be composed of Associated Student Union members only.

All membership lists are filed in the Associated Student Union Office.

ARTICLE 3: OFFICERS AND ELECTIONS

A. Titles and duties of officers

- a. President:
 - To preside over meetings of the club.
 - To call special meetings of the club.
 - To plan and prepare an agenda for the club meetings.
- b. Vice President:
 - To serve as the club president if the president becomes unable to fulfill his/her duties either temporarily or permanently.
 - To support the club president
- c. Treasurer:
 - To maintain complete and accurate record of all club receipts and disbursements.
 - To oversee club fund-raising efforts.
 - To supervise the preparation of the club budget.
- d. ICC Representative:
 - Attend ICC meetings on Thursdays.
 - Present information given at the meetings to the club.
- e. Secretary:
 - To maintain accurate minutes of each club meeting.
 - To carry out all correspondence for the club.
- f. Alternate ICC Representative:
 - To serve as the ICC representative if the ICC representative becomes unable to fulfill his/her duties either temporarily or permanently.

B. Elections of officers - Details:

All officers should be elected preceding the last two weeks of the semester.

C. Special Elections.

Upon an emergency, a special election may be held at the regular meeting of the club after notice at the immediately preceding regular meeting. The process of election will be the same as for the regular election in terms of voting and eligibility requirements.

D. Term of Office

Officers shall be elected for one semester. No student should hold the same office twice.

E. Special Requirements as to Scholastic Standing or Other Rules.

- All officers must be regularly enrolled students, have a "C" average at the time of the election and maintain a "C" average during their term of office.
- All members of service clubs must be in good standing and maintain a "C" average.

F. Definition of Quorum in Regard to the Council.

- Quorum should be at least a majority of members who attend.
- No group may set up a rule whereby the elected officers make all the decisions for the group.

ARTICLE 4: CLUB RULES

ARTICLE 5: AMENDMENTS TO THE CONSTITUTION

- A. Method of Origination:
 - Any member should have the right to propose an amendment.
- B. Requirements for Adoption.
 - No constitution should be adopted by less than a majority of the voting membership.

ARTICLE 6: PARLIAMENTARY PROCEDURE

- A. Parliamentary procedures will be in accordance with this Constitution. All procedures not approved for by this Constitution shall be governed by "Robert's Rules of Order, Newly Revised Edition."
