

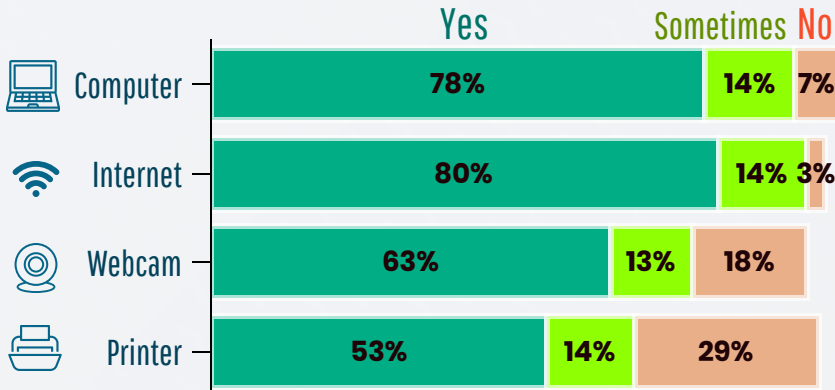
Spring 2020 Online Transition Survey

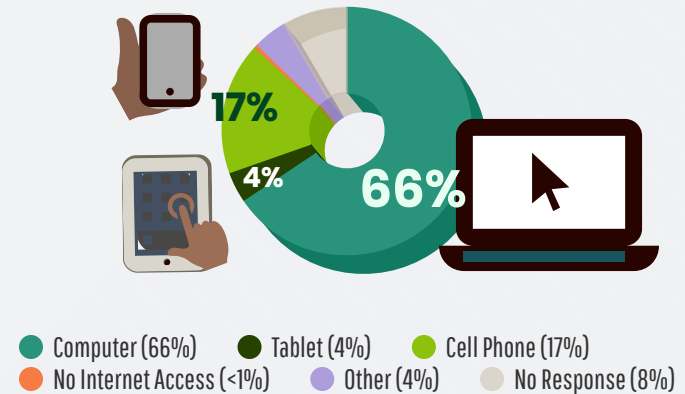

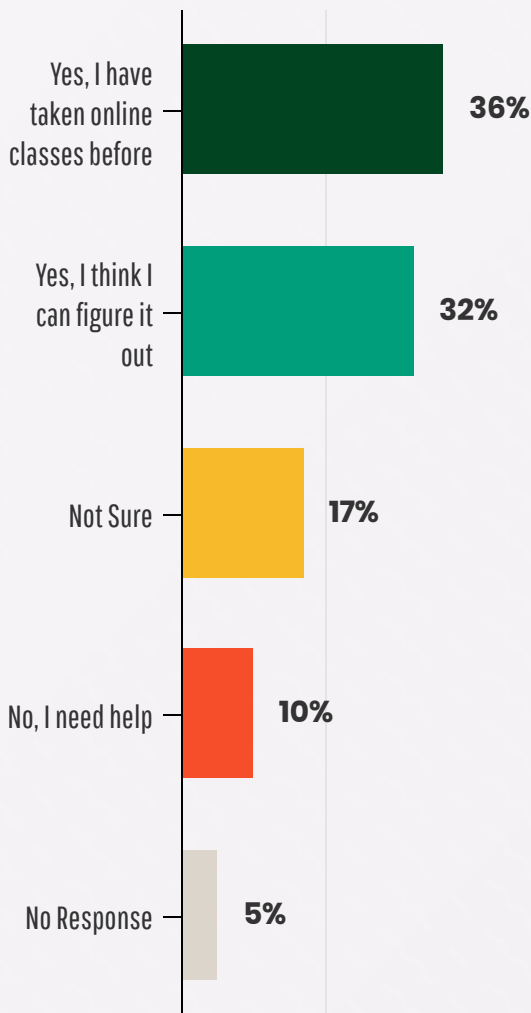
Students with Regular Access to Technology

Do you feel prepared for online classes?

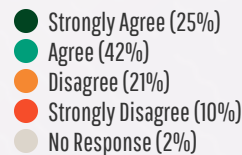


Moving to Online Classes

I have a quiet place to do my schoolwork

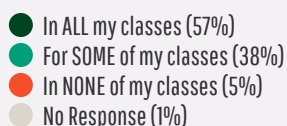


I have enough time to participate in classes

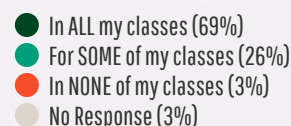


Since moving to online classes...

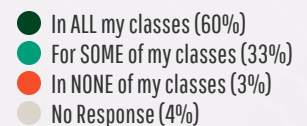
I have regular contact with my instructor

I know what work is expected of me in my classes

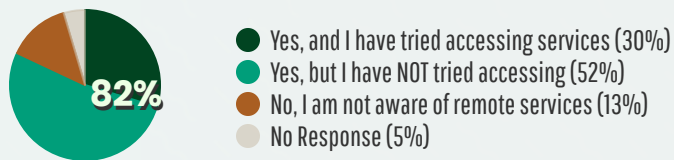

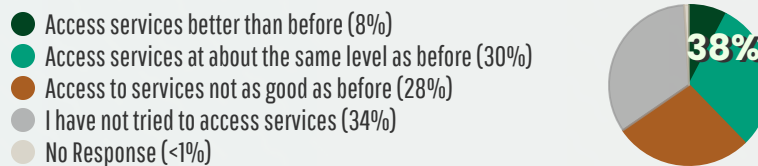
Do you feel informed about the changes made at your college in response to the COVID-19 pandemic?



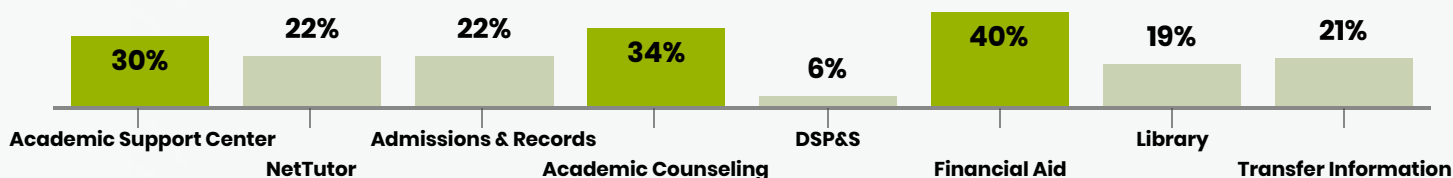
Are you aware college services are available remotely?



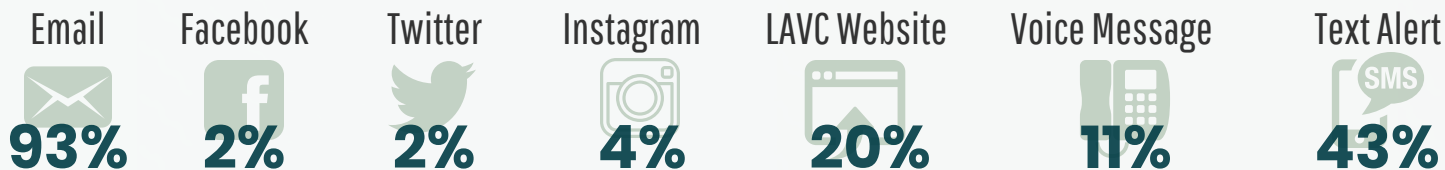
How well are you able to access services since the campus closed?

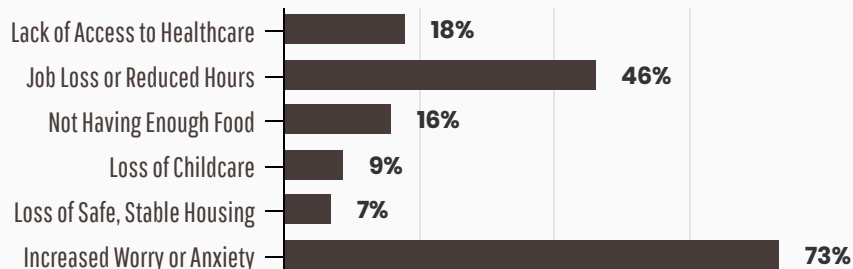
Now, I do not have access to the internet as easily nor can I go to public places because I am fearful of ... catching the virus and passing it to my mother in law [whose] immune system is compromised.
