## **L.A. VALLEY COLLEGE TO OFFER FALL 2015 LATE-START CLASSES; REGISTRATION OPENS SEPTEMBER 12**

**More than 50 late-start class sections—mostly online and hybrid—gives students more opportunities to “step forward” towards their degree**

VALLEY GLEN, CA – Los Angeles Valley College (LAVC) announced today that it will be offering 54 short-term, late-start class sections in the Fall 2015 Semester. These classes, which include a wide selection of UC/CSU-transferrable and online or hybrid courses, are scheduled to start the week of October 19.

“We are delighted to offer our students a variety of in-demand, short-term classes to help them ‘step forward’ in their educational goals,” said Dr. Erika Endrijonas, president of Los Angeles Valley College. “With more than 80% of these late-start courses being distance education or hybrid courses, students will have the flexibility to take courses from anywhere”.

“We want to help our students move towards transferring or earning their degree,” said Karen Daar, vice president of academic affairs. “By choosing to enroll one extra class this semester, they will be on track to earn their degree sooner and transfer earlier.”
