

RN to BSN — Stat

There's a shorter path to a RN to BSN. Students pursuing an Associate Degree in Nursing (ADN) typically have to wait until they finish it and secure their Registered Nurse License (RN) before beginning Bachelor of Science (BSN) courses. But not anymore.

With the help of our Concurrent Enrollment Program (CEP), students working on their ADN can also complete 4 upper division nursing courses while completing their ADN. These students are also eligible for our Tuition Guarantee program which will freeze their tuition at \$350 per credit hour while they complete their BSN program.

How it works

When students enroll in the CEP, they take classes between semesters at your community college. Students may begin after the first, second, or third semesters, and depending upon when they start, they can complete up to four upper division nursing courses.

CEP students are enrolled in courses with other ADN completers, providing students a built-in support system. And the best part is, the alliance we have with your community college allows the ADN to be transferred to University of Phoenix as a block of 90 credits. After completing the CEP courses, the student is left with only 7-9 courses to earn their RN to BSN degree.
