TRAINING MODELS

Los Angeles Valley College is equipped to meet the training needs of employers within the San Fernando Valley and across Los Angeles County. LAVC has worked alongside employers across industry sectors to develop training using three training models: apprenticeships, not-for-credit, and noncredit vocational education programs. Training can take a few weeks to develop or several months.

Apprenticeships

The apprenticeship model blends college instruction with on-the-job training. Students enroll in a series of college classes while employed as apprentices by employers. The training is no cost to the student and the Employer. Employers must pay to employ apprentices and pay them a livable wage. LAVC is currently developing a Community Health Worker Apprenticeship Program.

Not-for-Credit

The not-for-credit model is the most flexible training model. It allows the College to develop training to meet its immediate training needs and does not require students to become college students. Training can be paid for by the employer, agencies, and grants. The BioTech Training Academy is an example of a not-for-credit program.

Noncredit: VOC ED

The noncredit model uses noncredit courses and programs to provide short-term vocational education training. The training programs will consist of two or more noncredit courses that lead to a college credential. Enrollment in noncredit courses is at no cost to the student or employer. Currently, LAVC offers a wide range of vocational education noncredit certificate programs
