Articulation Agreement**

The Graziadio School accepts California IGETC and CSU courses for transfer into our BSM Program. Students need at least 60 units to transfer into the BSM Program as outlined below. All courses must be completed at a regionally accredited college or university.

SUBJECT AREA	REQUIRED COURSES	UNITS REQUIRED
ENGLISH COMPOSITION	1 course in English Reading & Composition; must have a grade of "C" or better	3 semester units
MATHEMATICS	1 course in Mathematics that must be the equivalent of College Algebra or higher; must have a grade of "C" or better	3 semester units
HISTORY	1 course in U.S. History I, U.S. History II or American Government	3 semester units
ARTS AND HUMANITIES	3 courses equivalent to 9 semester units	9 semester units
SOCIAL SCIENCES	3 courses equivalent to 9 semester units	9 semester units
NATURAL SCIENCES	3 semester units; no lab is required	3 semester units; no lab is required
GENERAL EDUCATION	All regionally accredited courses that would satisfy the above categories, as well as Computer Science and up to 4 semester units of Physical Education	15 GE semester units
ELECTIVES	All regionally accredited courses satisfy this category	15 semester units

- No language units are required
- No science labs are required
- Quarter units will be converted into semester unit equivalencies
- Students should have current full-time employment or significant prior work experience

GUIDELINES FOR TRANSFERABLE CREDIT

I. ENGLISH -1 course (3 semester units) such as: Freshman English Composition, College Composition, English Rhetoric, Composition and Literature, Expository Writing, English Expression. Unacceptable courses: Basic Grammar, English as a Second Language, Business English, English Fundamentals.

- Acceptable CLEP test: College Composition.

II. MATHEMATICS -1 course (3 semester units) such as: College Algebra, Trigonometry, Calculus, Geometry, and Statistics.

- Acceptable CLEP tests: Pre-Calculus, Calculus, College Algebra
- Acceptable DSST tests: Fundamentals of College Algebra, Principles of Statistics.

III. U.S. HISTORY or AMERICAN GOVERNMENT -1 course (3 semester units) such as: Survey of U.S. History, American Government, National Government.

- Acceptable CLEP tests: American Government, History of the U.S. I, History of the U.S. II.

IV. SOCIAL SCIENCE -3 courses (9 semester units) such as: Cultural Anthropology, Psychology, History, Political Science, Cultural Geography, Archaeology, Economics, American Institutions, and Sociology.

- Acceptable CLEP tests: American Government, Introductory Sociology, Western Civilization I, Western Civilization II, Introductory Psychology, Principles of Macro Economics, Principles of Micro Economics, Human Growth and Development, History of the U.S. I, History of the U.S. II.
- Acceptable DSST tests: An Introduction to the Modern Middle East, Human/Cultural Geography, Rise and Fall of the Soviet Union, A History of the Vietnam War, The Civil War and Reconstruction, Lifespan Developmental Psychology, General Anthropology.

V. HUMANITIES AND FINE ARTS -3 courses (9 semester units) such as: Art, Drama, English, History, Literature, Music, Philosophy, Religion, Speech, Stage Management, Communication, Photography, Journalism, Foreign Language, Theater Arts.

- Acceptable CLEP tests: Western Civilization I, Western Civilization II, American Literature, English Literature, Analyzing and Interpreting Literature, College Level French Language, College Level German Language, College Level Spanish Language, History of the U.S. I, History of the U.S. II.
- Acceptable DSST tests: Art of the Western World, Ethics in America or (SF 474 Ethics in American Essay), Introduction to World Religions, Principles of Public Speaking.

VI. NATURAL SCIENCE -1 course (3 semester units, lab not required) such as: General Biology, General Chemistry, Physics, Physical Geography, Physical Anthropology, Marine Science, Oceanography, Ecology, Geology, Earth Science, Microbiology, Physiology, Botany, Zoology, Anatomy, Astronomy, and Meteorology.

- Unacceptable course: Health.
- Acceptable CLEP tests: Biology, Chemistry.
- Acceptable DSST tests: Astronomy, Environment and Humanity (The Race to Save the Planet), Principles of Physical Science I, Physical Geography.
